



## **MHMHA Female Year End Director Report 2019/2020**

There were a total of 133 girls who played from MHMHA this year.

### **Timbit**

This year in the Timbits division we had 15 females play for the female Wildcats.

While 16 played co-ed.

### **Novice**

This year in Novice we had 15 females play for the female Wildcats. The team participated in the Novice 'B' division.

While 9 females played co-ed.

### **Atom**

This year in Atom we had 25 females placed on 2 different city teams that participated in the Atom 'B' city division.

While 2 females played co-ed.

### **Peewee**

This year in Peewee we had 35 females make up two teams. They were evaluated and placed on an 'A' level RMFHL travel team and a 'B' level RMFHL team. Both teams had fantastic seasons. Our 'B' team won the RMFHL Blue Division League Championship. While our 'A' team defended their Zone 6 championship title. They were announced as Co-League Champions as their year was cut short and were unable to finish their League Championship series. As well, they were not able to participate in the Provincial 'A' Female Championship. Both due to Covid-19 Lockdown.

While 2 females played co-ed.

### **Bantam**

There were 6 females who reside with MHMHA & played with the Southern Express 'AA' zone team.

There were 4 females who played co-ed in the Bantam City League.

### **Midget**

There were 3 females who reside with MHMHMA & played on the Southern Express 'AA' zone team.

There was 1 female who played in the Midget City League.

### **Survey Results/Feedback**

Overall lots of positive feedback. The numbers for female hockey are continuing to trend up in regards to numbers as they have been in the last 5 years.

Improvements can be made with mentorship with the older age groups mentoring younger age groups.

More female coaching help would be an area that can be improved as well.

Recommended to expand the Female Director role to a Female Rep/Travel Director (older age groups) and a Female City Director (younger age groups). MHMHA will be seeking volunteers to take on these roles heading into the 2020/2021 season.
